

**RES. 107/1/GC 7/2507 (1964)(2)**

It is recommended that the annual dues be increased from Rs. 100 to Rs. 200 for the WFB Administration. (Article 19 of the Constitution to be amended to this effect )

**RES. 108/2/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

It is recommended that a WFB Foundation be created, the control of which will rest with the Executive

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- (1) Instead of “adding” the text of the Res. to Art. 12 (1) of the Constitution, the Resolution has been numbered as Art. 12 (2) with the words “... or integrity...” omitted. No reason could be found.

Council. The funds will be used for the purpose of implementing projects approved by the Executive Council.

**RES. 109/3/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

That the WFB should encourage the establishment of training centres in Buddhist countries for the education of both Bhikkhus and Bhikkhunis.

**RES. 110/4/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

That Regional Centres should examine the pioneer work of the Singapore Centre in the publication of its bi-lingual Graduate Course on the Teaching of the Lord Buddha, compiled by Miss Pitt Chin Hui, and consider preparing their own equivalent course for the education of children in Buddhist principles.

**RES. 111/5/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

That even where it proved impossible to have Buddhism taught as such in the national schools of any country, efforts should be made to introduce Buddhist principles under the heading of Ethics. Examples are Tolerance, Ahimsa (no injury to any living things) and the doctrine of Karma (in Pali, Kamma) as the necessary sanction for right action.

**RES. 112/6/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

That the Fellowship publish in the Bulletin a list of Buddhist Universities and Institutions with a view to encouraging exchange visits of professors and students and exchange of publications of all kinds.

**RES. 113/7/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

The 7<sup>th</sup> Conference of the WFB recommends the formation of a Research Committee on economic and social aspects in respective Regional Centres to promote prosperity and social welfare among Buddhists in their respective lands

and that the results of such research be forwarded to the WFB Headquarters for collation and implementation wherever possible.

**RES. 114/8/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

The 7<sup>th</sup> Conference of the WFB, bearing in mind that general and complete disarmament is a universal necessity for the well-being of mankind, resolves and calls upon the United Nations to take urgent and necessary action to stop the arms race.

**RES. 115/9/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

The 7<sup>th</sup> Conference of the WFB, bearing in mind our Buddhist teachings, appeals to all countries to settle whatever territorial or border disputes which may arise by peaceful negotiation without resort to any form of violence.

**RES. 116/10/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

The 7<sup>th</sup> Conference of the WFB, recognising the community leadership role that the Sangha has, recommends that support be given to positive and constructive social and community service projects carried out under the auspices of the Sangha as well as lay Buddhist organizations.

**RES. 117/11/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

The 7<sup>th</sup> Conference of the WFB, bearing in mind that one of the main aims and objects of our Organization is to promote humanitarian services, appeals to all member organizations to render whatever assistance they can in the event of any natural calamity occurring in any country.

**RES. 118/12/GC 7/2507 (1964)**

That a booklet containing the basic tenets of Buddhism without any sectarian bias be published under the

auspices of the WFB for introducing the Buddha's teachings among non-Buddhists and in Buddhist countries. This booklet, first in English, may be translated into as many languages as possible. The collaboration of competent Buddhists and WFB Regional Centres must be invited to compile this booklet. All Regional Centres should send relevant documents and booklets to the Secretariat for the purpose.

**RES. 119/13/GC 7/2507 (1964)<sup>(1)</sup>**

(a) Wherever possible, the WFB Regional Centres should assist in promoting cooperation and unity among all faiths so as to prevent misunderstandings and ensure that the moral and social development, stability, security and progress of all will be achieved.

(b) Buddhist organizations should attempt to find areas of cooperation with other faiths for the development of the community as a whole in joint programmes particularly in the field of social services and community development.

(c) Buddhist organizations should act in cooperation with all faiths and religious organizations for the preservation of world peace.

**RES. 120/14/GC 7/2507 (1964)<sup>(2)</sup>**

The World Fellowship of Buddhists severely disapproves of the use of the image of the Buddha in an irreverent manner in television, sculpture, motion pictures, advertising, trade marks and other mass media. It is emphasized that this is a hallowed symbol.
