Resolution 2

The Nineteenth General Conference of the World Fellowship of Buddhists:

Considering that the prevailing spiritual and intellectual climate favours a pro-pluralistic world vision and, for this purpose, the Buddhist Dhammadūta activities should be guided and implemented by persons who are well experienced in the educational process in multicultural settings;

It is resolved that in the training of Dhammadūta works, both Saṅgha and lay,

- 1. World languages, specially English should receive the highest attention;
- A proper grasp and understanding of the cultural background of the host community whether it be in the Western world or India or Hispanic countries should be achieved; and
- 3. The needs of such regions as Latin America, where a demand for Buddhism is envisaged by a growing interest should receive special attention. \Box
