

RESOLUTIONS

1. To form a foundation to support the activities of The WFB.
2. For The WFB to act immediately in the event of Natural Disasters.
3. To organise study tours and workshops during General Conferences to promote humanitarian services to people in need in disaster areas, orphanages, hospitals and areas of poverty.
4. To make aware of the problem of unethical religious conversions and resist such conversions through education and poverty alleviation projects.
5. To publish a book for children in English to introduce them to Buddhist values and morality based on the Jataka Tales.
6. To incorporate news and photographs on Regional Centre activities in The WFB Review, collected from the Regional Centres for enhanced information.
7. To forward the completed software of The WFB Regional Centre Online Art Exhibition to The WFB together with proposals regarding content submission guidelines for consideration and approval.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. To promote Dharma propagation by Regional Centres through research and media.
2. To promote awareness on domestic violence and sexual abuse.
3. To encourage Buddhist women with diverse expertise and experiences to be engaged in helping the less fortunate.
4. To promote more equal opportunities for Buddhist women wherever applicable.

5. For Regional Centres in Western countries to examine opportunities to foster cooperation and harmony between their local Buddhist communities through organising a joint annual United Nations Observation of Vesak celebration in their own region.
6. To introduce the Common Chanting to all the Regional Centres for implementation.
7. To organise an exchange visit program between the Regional Centres of the various countries.
8. To create a WFB Unity and Solidarity Award for Individuals and Organisations for their achievement in the area of unity and solidarity.
9. For The WFB to declare a Global Warming Day to develop awareness of the dangers of Global Warming and climate change and contribute to remedial action by refraining from driving, turning off lights and other electrical equipments, eating vegetarian, conserving energy and resources. and practising meditation.
10. For The WFB Vice-President in charge of the regional area to take steps to introduce The WFB including its role and objectives to organisations which have a prospect to join The WFB as a Regional Centre.

Special Resolution

11. To form / establish The WFB Humanitarian Relief Fund whose members shall be appointed by the President of The WFB.
